Reading

Luke 19:28-40

Reflection: The Kingdom Comes - Sue Jackson

So here we are the third week into a new way of meeting, and I can't help but reflect on how different things looked at the beginning of the year when I'd made my New Year resolutions. One was to read my Bible in a Year every day. (working progress), pray more (not enough to date), thank God and praise Him for who He is, go to bed earlier (mostly....), another one was to see more of my family and friends.... To meet for coffee to say yes to gatherings and celebrations. I have now started dreaming of when we will all gather again, what a celebration that will be!

In our passage today we see the people gathered on that first Palm Sunday, Praising God laying down their garments and waving their palm branches and recognising who Jesus is and proclaimed him to be the promised King who will bring deliverance, A Saviour for everybody!

Predicted more than 500 years before it happened, Zechariah 9:9 says:

"Rejoice greatly, Daughter Zion! Shout, Daughter Jerusalem! See, your king comes to you, righteous and victorious, Lowly and riding on a donkey, On a colt, the foal of a donkey".

And so today we too celebrate the entry of King Jesus into Jerusalem, albeit very different to the original planning meeting for this year! It was a day that marked the beginning of an incredible week. A week that would see Jesus cheered then arrested, tried then crucified. But as that week came to an end, another week began, just as the previous week had begun.. With a celebration!

Whilst we're not gathering together physically, the invitation to meet and worship Jesus our King was for everyone then and is for everyone today!

I must admit to finding it hard to have a celebratory mindset as I write this, so I found this quote from J John this week helpful:

"We are Easter people living in a Good Friday world", and because of that we can join in with the celebration and lift our voices to worship Jesus, our Saviour, even when we are in this uncertainty, and not able to gather together and wave our palm branches in unison.

Just as this prophecy was fulfilled when Jesus came to earth, so the prophecies of his second coming are just as certain to come true.

As we begin Holy Week, even in this time apart, but together, our voices can join with the people of Jerusalem some 2000 years ago:

"The whole crowd of disciples began joyfully to praise God in loud voices for all the miracles they had seen: Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!".

Let us pray.

Father God, Thank you for this day that you have made. I pray that as we reflect on Palm Sunday and this Holy Week, we can lift our eyes and worship and follow Jesus our Saviour, our King, in all circumstances. Amen.
